Dear COTD Family,

I want to invite you to the Church Growth Masterclass we're holding Friday night, October 18, 2019 from 6 - 8:30 PM and Saturday morning, October 19, 2019 from 8:30 AM - 12 PM. I realize this is a big ask of your time. But I'm asking because I believe COTD's future will be determined, in large part, by church members who understand the issues facing the church during the present time. COTD cannot afford to ignore current church realities. Bill Wilson wrote the following in the most recent Center for Healthy Churches newsletter:


"The painful truth of the 21<sup>st</sup> century traditional congregation is that it faces a very grim future without significant intervention. More than the usual hyperbole or alarmist rhetoric, the crisis is real. David Olson, of the American Church Project, has documented the painful truth carefully. (<a href="www.theamericanchurch.org">www.theamericanchurch.org</a>) Olson, using realistic counts of attendees, reveals that traditional, established congregations that are more than 40 years old are in steady and persistent decline. Some are in dramatic decline. This tends to hold true regardless of theology, worship style, denomination or locale."


As many of you may know, COTD has been in decline for the last thirty years. We all would like to see a return to the "good old days" when the sanctuary was full and COTD seemingly did not lack financially. But those good old days are **probably** not coming back for COTD or thousands of other traditional congregations. The congregations that will survive and thrive today will be those who understand the times and act on today's realities not yesterday's successes.

The Church Growth Masterclass is designed to inform us about current realities, but more than that, to start a discussion among church members about what is needed at COTD. This is especially important since we have entered into a season of discussing what we, the church, will do with the 2 plus million dollars we will receive from the sale of the College Park Towers. Yet, more important than a discussion about dollars is a discussion about people—how to reach them for Christ, minister to them in Christ's name, and be the body of Christ for each other.

I could go on and on about the importance of this event, but let me conclude by saying that COTD needs your presence at the Church Growth Masterclass this weekend. My hope, my prayer, is that, if you are able, you will make the sacrifice of time by attending.


November 3 – November 24: 4-week Theology Seminar Sunday, 5:30p-6:30p- "Anticipating Advent"




